### **CEO** welcome





2022-2023 has been a successful year for Life's Little Treasures Foundation (LLTF). The foundation hit a huge milestone - 18 years of supporting families - and we celebrated in style with our Birthday Gala held in Melbourne, sponsored by long term partner, Britax.

Baby Bunting raised an astonishing \$550,000 for LLTF by running their 8-week campaign online and instore as part of our annual Walk for Prems fundraiser. This income ensured we could continue our services and grow our team by four, filling key positions to expand our national reach.

We also piloted our Breast Pump Program – presented by our partner, Medela – and together we distributed 144 breast pumps so families in need could continue their breast-feeding journey.

Haakaa continued to sponsor LLTF and supported us through donating product for our Precious Prem packs and for different events and campaigns. They once again supported our Twins and Triplets Tribute Day in February which raises awareness of the challenges families with sick or premature multiples face.



## products and services



LLTF has had a busy year expanding its team with a new State Coordinator - SA/NT, State Coordinator - VIC/TAS, Special Projects Coordinator and Community Liaison Officer. This expansion has enabled us to increase the distribution of resources and raise more awareness of LLTF in the community so we can help families when they need it most.

Through this expansion, we have seen growth across all areas. We saw our NICU Connections online groups continue to be regularly accessed by families in the neonatal units and after they transition home with a total of 1220 participants across our three online support groups.

With COVID restrictions easing for some hospitals around the country, we were able to host 26 in-hospital NICU Connection events in three out of our eight participating hospitals – The Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital, The Royal Women's Hospital (VIC) and Mercy Hospital for Women (VIC).

A special mention must go to our Dads who volunteer and run our NICU Connections events on Wednesday nights for Dads and carers. These are special events on Facebook have been an amazing outlet for Dads and carers in our community.

#### **PRODUCT & SERVICES**

We saw significant growth in orders of our Precious Prem Packs with our fabulous warehouse volunteers packing 1556 packs, an increase from 1220 packs the previous year. We also delivered 21,974 gifts to parents in-hospital through our Milestone Gift Giving Program.

Our Brekkie Bar continues to be very well received with the program now available at two new Queensland hospitals with thanks to a generous donor, Sam Johnson and his wife Krystal.

We are now delivering 4260 brekkie boxes, 960 snack boxes and 18 Coles deliveries across 11 hospitals.

Over the last 12 months, LLTF and Medela have been working together on the Breast Pump Program and have provided 144 breast pumps to vulnerable mothers in the NICU and SCN trying to establish and maintain their milk supply. Thanks to the success of the pilot program, we are delighted to announce that Medela has generously agreed to increase its donation to 278 units in 2023-2024.

We'd also like to acknowledge the neonatal nurses who look after our most vulnerable babies and celebrated International Nurses Day by sending out 9130 packets of Iollies to Neonatal Units across Australia.

# marketing & communications







"As the nation opened up post-pandemic, we focused in on the importance of connection and looked for ways to bring our community together through our marketing efforts."

In its 13th year, our flagship event - Walk for Prems was an astounding success in terms of community engagement and fundraising. Returning to hosting a physical event in each state around the country (while also offering the option for registrants to participate virtually), we had a total of 3,278 sign up to take part - an increase of 39% from the year prior. Although this is lower than pre-COVID registration figures in 2019, we are proud of the number of people who showed their commitment to supporting LLTF, despite many battling mental health issues, financial hardship or going through the prem/sick baby experience in the present moment. Through this campaign, we raised a record \$810,454 with thanks to 2.601 online fundraisers as well as the generosity of our Presenting Partner, Baby Bunting.

For the first time since Walk For Prem's inception, we appointed six families (one per state) to act as ambassadors for the campaign. Taking on the role of spokespeople for LLTF, our ambassadors enabled us to harness the power of storytelling to achieve 59 pieces of media coverage, reaching an audience of over 3.26 million nationwide. They also helped to create a deep sense of community by openly sharing their personal stories and encouraging others to do the same. This helped to generate greater awareness around our Walk For Prems campaign and LLTF more broadly.

Another notable event in the LLTF calendar was World Prematurity Day. On 17 November, we joined the global movement to help raise awareness for the 15 million babies born premature annually worldwide – 26,000 of which are born in Australia each year.







### **MARKETING & COMMUNICATIONS**

While our marketing efforts focused predominantly on educating the wider community around the challenges families face when their baby is born early, we also used this opportunity to re-engage those within our community by celebrating the little treasures who have graduated from neonatal units to go home and honoured those babies born too early to survive. We did this by hosting a luncheon where we brought together families, partners, volunteers and health professionals in a wonderful display of unity as they shared differing perspectives on what World Prematurity Day means to them.

We also sent 250 lapel pins and a pair of tiny booties to parliamentarians across Australia to encourage open dialogue surrounding the challenges of preterm birth with the hopes of garnering more support for families of premature babies. It was wonderful to see many members of parliament posting content across their social channels in support of our cause.

We gifted World Prematurity Day milestone cards to 149 hospitals, asking them to pass these onto families in the neonatal unit so that they can mark this special day and help us in sharing our message. In addition, we also sent gifts packs to hospitals Australia-wide to thank the health professionals who work tirelessly to take such special care of our little treasures.

We are also grateful to the wonderful team at AAMI Park who agreed to light up their landmark in purple in a show of solidarity to help increase awareness and understanding of the impacts of prematurity on families and the wider community. •

Monica's son Killian was born at 26 weeks due to PROMM and after spending 83 days in hospital, he was able to go home, in time for his first Christmas.

"He's been a little fighter since day one, making his entrance face first and crying without any need for resuscitation! Killian spent the whole time in hospital kicking goals and we spent every night filling in our premmie journals (x2) from LLTF. Killian came home on a low level of oxygen due to his stubborn habit of holding his breath and we are so incredibly proud of him. From 840g at birth to almost 3.5kg, Killian is our little treasure."

#### Nicole and Harvey

Harvey was born at 29 weeks at 1497g after a very rough, low fluid pregnancy and PROMM. On his day of birth, Nicole and her husband we were told they could put Harvey into palliative care or try an operation (to repair a tracheosophageal fistula), which he was highly unlikely to survive.

10 months, 8 brain surgeries, 4 abdominal surgeries, 3 ICU stays, a brain infection, COVID and a massive surgery to connect his esophagus to his stomach, Harvey is going from strength to strength.

"The LLTF Walk for Prems takes place a day after Harvey's first birthday this year. It's a way to provide vital funds for family support (like Precious Prem packs and the NICU connections support group) that is vital on journeys like ours. It's also a chance to recognise and celebrate the fighting spirit of many battle warriors and their families."

Baby Elsie was born at the height of the pandemic after what was a high-risk pregnancy for mum, Natalie. Born at 30 weeks and weighing only 1kg, Elsie faced many complications including respiratory difficulties, multiple ventricular septal defects and a haemangioma over her right temple. She was discharged from hospital on her due date, after spending 69 days in NICU and SCN.

"If I can take away even one ounce of fear, self-doubt or depression for another family by fundraising and trying to help get the word out about this amazing foundation then I am extremely happy, and it is worth every second."


#### Katrina and Lachlan

We have a memorial cabinet in our living room that Lachlan talks to every day. It's definitely not easy being a parent to premature babies with all the expensive therapies but we are more than blessed to have Lachlan here with us today.
